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Chicago-St. Louis Corridor



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
- » IDOT has actively developed the corridor since the mid1980's

- Previously completed Environmental Studies

What are we building?

- » Upgrades for passenger speeds up to 110 mph
- Design and construction of 243 miles of main track including concrete ties, welded rail, etc between East St. Louis and Joliet
- » Realignment of curves
- » New second tracks and sidings
- » Grade crossing warning devices
- » Construction of grade crossings
- » Train control signaling
- >> Turnouts, culverts, bridges, fencing, etc.
- » Purchase of six new high-speed train sets
- » Eight (8) new/renovated stations










Schedule

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Program Milestones



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- » Public Operation of Higher-Speed Service between Dwight and Pontiac
 - Began November 22, 2012
 - Three northbound
 (300, 302, and 304) and
 three southbound
 (301, 305, and 307) trains







Construction Accomplishments

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- Since 2010, the Program has completed the following tasks
 - Installation of over 243 track-miles of new rail
 - Installation of 635,168 new concrete ties
 - Spreading of 1,305,873 tons of stone ballast
 - Interim renewal of 225 crossing surfaces and approaches
 - Final renewal of 24 crossing surfaces and approaches
 - Installed four quadrant gate systems within 120 miles of the corridor









Construction Accomplishments

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» Significant Grade Crossing Upgrades:

- Completed diagnostics at 270 locations
- Extensive liaison with IDOT Highways, locals, ICC, FRA, others
- Extensive safety features and physical upgrades





Construction Accomplishments

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» Crossing Safety Features







- -New sidings and second track
- –Upgrades to bridges and culverts
- -Drainage improvements
- Installation and upgrades to signal and wayside equipment
- -Continued crossing and approach improvements

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Station Improvements

» Joliet

- Received a discretionary grant to construct a multi-modal facility and to make safety improvements
- Two of three construction phases are underway; design work continues

» Dwight

- Proposed site south of the current location on Village property
- Plans in the design phase
- Categorical exclusion complete

» Pontiac

- Proposed site southwest of the existing station on City property
- Categorical exclusion almost complete
- Plans in the design phase





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Station Improvements



» Normal

– New multi-modal facility opened in July 2012

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- Funded with a Transportation Investments Generating Economic Recovery (TIGER) grant
- Second platform and passenger grade separation to be built using High-Speed Rail (HSR) funding
- Improvements in the design phase

» Lincoln

- Plans for upgrades in the conceptual design phase
- Categorical exclusion complete





Station Improvements

» Springfield

Plans for upgrades in the design phase

» Carlinville

- Proposed site near the current facility
- Plans in the design phase

» Alton

- Environmental Assessment (EA) completed
- Selected to receive TIGER grant funding
- Will integrate a new IDOT HSR station and a multi-modal facility (in conceptual design phase)











Equipment



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Equipment

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- » Joint procurement with multiple states
- » New passenger cars
 - Accessible, car-borne lifts
- » New locomotives (125 mph capability)














