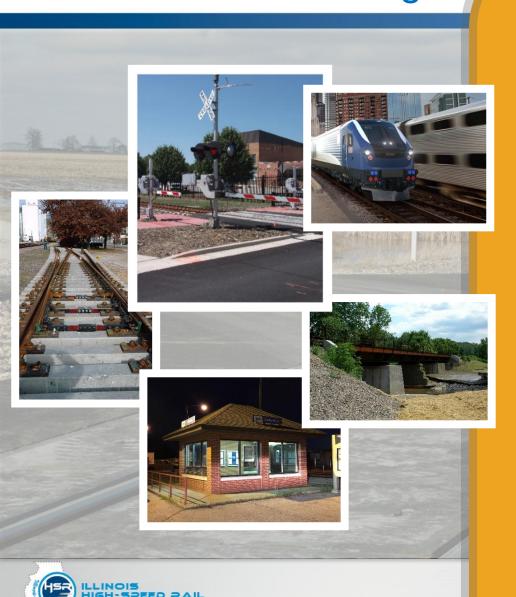

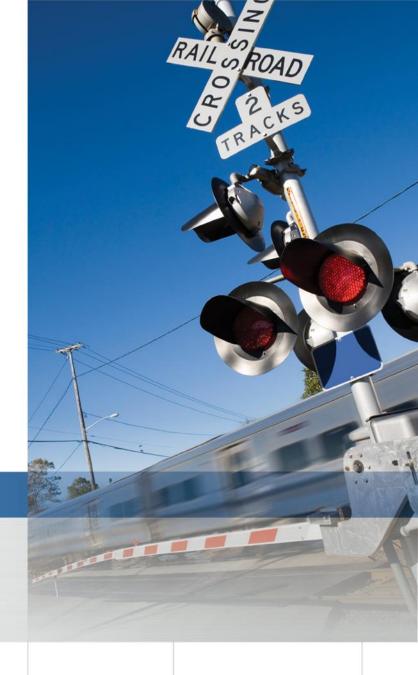






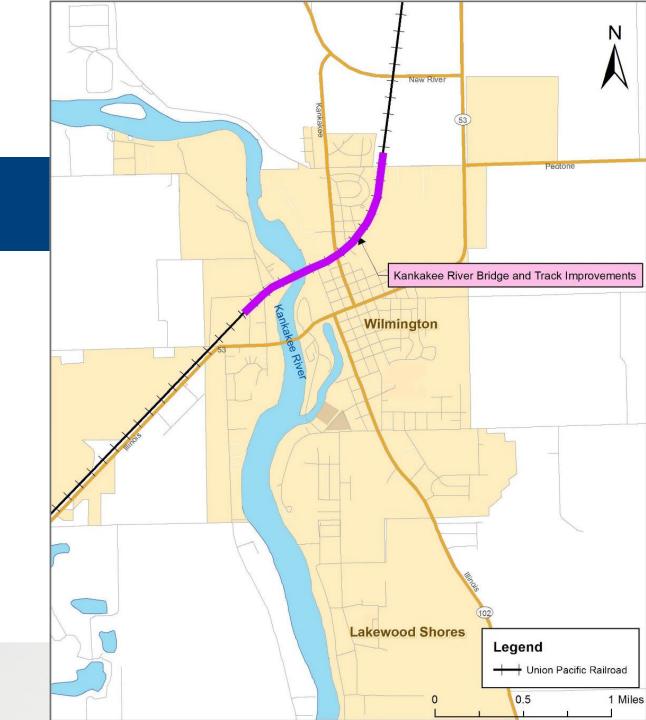
Kankakee River Bridge and Track Improvements Project







Project Location





- » Improve passenger rail service
- » Improve/replace deteriorating or functionally obsolete transportation components
- » Fulfill the need for additional mainline track
 - Enhance operations
 - Increase reliability





Build Alternative Map





Supports the Purpose and Need of the Project

- A.35 acres of additional right-of-way and 1.08 acre of temporary construction easement
- Shift existing track location
- » Replace Kankakee River, Water Street and Forked Creek bridges
- » New rail maintenance access road
- Orade-crossing improvements, new fencing, roadway and signal improvements
- » Drainage improvements





- » Install four-quadrant gates and pedestrian gates
- » Reconstruct North Kankakee Street between Canal Street and Chicago Street, including both intersections
- Raise roadway up to 6 feet on both sides of track
- Install retaining walls
- » Reconstruct sidewalk behind retaining walls



Three grade separation alternatives were evaluated:

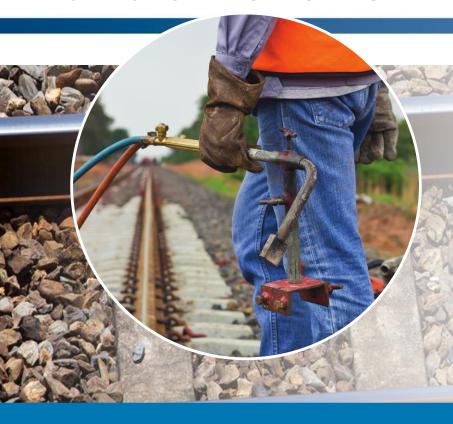
- 1. Closing North Kankakee Street and improving existing Water Street grade separation
- 2. Raising the existing railroad tracks over North Kankakee Street
- 3. Reconstructing North Kankakee Street under the existing railroad tracks

Not recommended due to adverse impacts, including:

- displacement of residents and businesses
- new right-of-way needs
- changed access to businesses
- » new traffic patterns
- flooding issues with underpasses







- No change to single mainline track
- Routine maintenance only
- No change to existing infrastructure and track signal equipment
- × Does not improve deteriorating infrastructure
- Does not improve operations and increase reliability of passenger rail





- » Evaluation of potential impacts on natural and human environments
- Study area spans approximately 1.3 miles within the City of Wilmington
 - Kankakee River Drive on the north
 - N. 1st Street on the south
- Compares the potential impacts between the Build Alternative and the No Build Alternative





- Evaluates potential effects on federally listed species, designated and proposed critical habitats
- Potential impacts found for:
 - 2 federally listed threatened or endangered species
- » Coordination with U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service for mitigation





Summary of Potential Impacts

- » Acquisition and temporary easements
 - No home displacement
- » Displacement of selfstorage facility
- » Vegetation loss
- » Wetlands
- Water quality
- » Protected species
- » Train noise
- » Construction







- Aesthetics re-vegetation » after construction
- Vegetation and Habitat restore ground surface
- Wetlands mitigation banking for permanent impacts
- Water Quality Construction Best Management Practices

- Protected Species construction timing and relocation
- Train noise quiet zone
- Construction and travel impacts coordination with City of Wilmington, including emergency services





Upcoming Construction

- Temporary partial or full closure of track crossings
- Detours coordinated with City, emergency departments, schools
- Temporary bridge
- Temporary closure of Water St.
 - N. Kankakee St. and Water St. will not be closed at the same time
- Temporary closure of Kankakee St. crossing
 - Detoured to River Rd. or Water St. and IL-53
- Access to businesses maintained

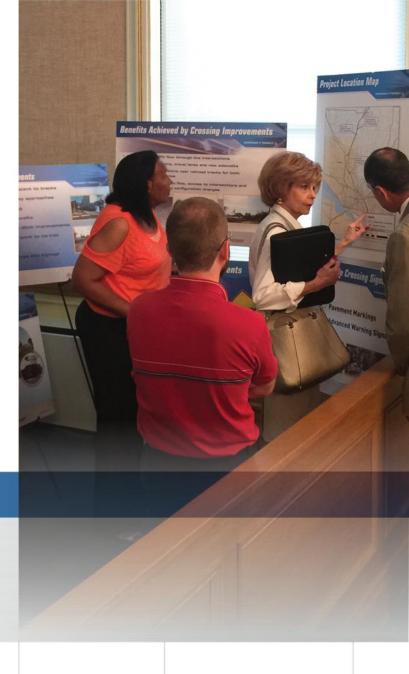

Bidding Process

Thank you for your interest in business opportunities with the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) and the Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR). The bidding process for both organizations will require prequalification. Please follow the guidelines outlined for IDOT and UPRR. Please note the UPRR will require contractors to be prequalified for each High-Speed Rail

Additionally, minority-owned and women-owned companies are required to receive certification through IDOT for the Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Certification (DBE) program. IDOT fosters equal opportunity for minority-owned, women-owned and other DBEs in IDOT's federal and statefunded contracts

Current Business Opportunities Process:

- 1. Prime contractors have 30 days to become prequalified for each business opportunity (see Pregualification Notices).
- 2. After the 30 day period, a list of prequalified prime contractors information will become available on the HSR Current Business Opportunities page of this website.
- 3. Once the prime contractors' information is available, the sub-consultants/DBE's have the opportunity to market their services and to contact the pregualified prime contractors for inclusion in a particular bidding opportunity.

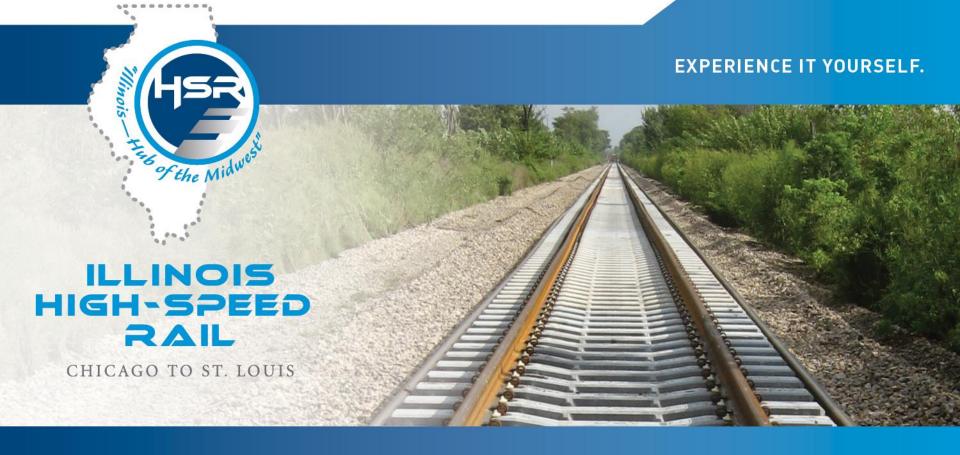
